Selection Process

STEP 1: SUBMIT PREREQUISITES

Listed within this package are prerequisites that must be received by the Academy prior to an invite to Selection being issued.

To be eligible for a certain Selection Day, prerequisites must be received **one week prior** to the scheduled Selection Day.

A list of prerequisite items is included on <u>page 3</u> of this package.

*Note: Should you not have the required vaccinations/ proof of immunity items, please talk to our Admissions Team as you may still be able to receive an invite to Selection.

STEP 2: SELECTION DAY

Once prerequisites have been received and verified by the Admissions Team, you will be invited to attend a Selection Day.

An invite will be issued, which will provide you with a time-slot, as well as information to help you prepare.

During the Selection Day, you will complete a <u>Paramedic Physical Abilities Test.</u> as well as a Panel Interview with members of our Faculty.

STEP 3: OFFER OF ACCEPTANCE

Should you be successful in our Selection Process, you will receive a letter of acceptance and a seat will be placed on hold for you.

In order to confirm your seat, you will need to pay the Seat Deposit as outlined in our <u>Fee & Payment</u> Schedule.

Note: Failure to provide a Seat Deposit by the next scheduled Selection Day, will result in your seat being released to another candidate.

A Career as a Paramedic

Paramedics operate in a variety of environments including on an ambulance, in clinics, on aircraft, and in special response vehicles.

Paramedics are versatile medical professionals that are tasked with performing patient assessments, interpreting diagnostics, and performing interventions.

A career in Paramedicine is very rewarding, as you can make a difference in someone's life every time you come to work. However, this does not come without a cost. Paramedics commonly work 12-hour rotating shifts and are faced with both physical and mental stress daily.

It is important that these valued medical professionals maintain physical fitness and have strong support systems in place, to ensure longevity in this line of work.

Admission Pathways

In order to qualify for entrance into the program, you must be **at least 19 years of age** prior to the start of the Ambulance Preceptorship.

The Ambulance Preceptorship takes place during the third week of April in each academic year.

Traditional Admissions Pathway:

Documents to Submit:

Proof of Grade 12 Diploma or equivalent.

If you are currently in Grade 12, a letter from your school stating that you are a student in good standing is required.

Transcript of marks, with the following mandatory courses completed:

If in progress, a letter from your school stating that you are expected to complete the required courses with the minimum average mark indicated below:

- **Biology 11 or 12** with a minimum average of 65%
- English 11 or 12 with a minimum average of 65%
- Math 11 or 12 with a minimum average of 65%

Mature Student Admissions Pathway:

OLS Academy understands that changes in life's trajectory can occur at any stage. It is strongly felt that no individual should face undue challenges in changing that trajectory no matter the timing of their decision to do so.

Individuals classed as "Mature Students" will have the opportunity to enroll into OLS Academy's Primary Care Program via an alternate admissions path.

A Mature Student is an applicant who:

 Is at least 21 years of age AND DOES NOT meet the admission requirements for direct acceptance via the traditional admissions pathway.

The eligibility for Mature Students will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis, with the following taken into consideration:

- Work experience
- Panel interview results
- Comportment

Candidates pursuing the Mature Student Pathway to admission, must submit:

Proof of High School graduation or GED

Resume with Cover Letter

Regardless of Admission Pathway, all candidates must submit the following:

Proof of a valid Driver's License or Government issued I.D.

Note: A valid Class 4 Driver's License will be required to obtain employment as a Paramedic

A Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Check. (\$20-\$50) Valid within the past 30 days.

Immunization Record or Proof of Immunity to: (\$0-\$150)

- MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella)
- Pertussis (Whooping Cough)
- Tetanus
- Diphtheria
- Hepatitis B
- Varicella

Proof of two-step Tuberculosis (TB) screening (\$100-\$200)

Complete the Pre-Selection Package:

- The Candidate Information Form
- The Pre-Selection Self-Interview Questionnaire
- The Interview with a Paramedic Form
- The Professional Reference Form

Pay Application Fee (\$100 plus HST)

Note: Additional fees may be incurred for items such as a Criminal Record Check, Immunizations, Blood work, and TB Screening. These fees remain the responsibility of the applicant.

Language Proficiency

OLS Academy's Primary Care Paramedic program is provided exclusively in **English.**

Candidates must demonstrate proficiency in English, prior to being granted acceptance into the program.

Candidates can demonstrate English proficiency in one or more of the following ways:

- The candidate indicates that their first language is English; or
- The candidate provides proof of successful completion of high school or post-secondary education, where course delivery was in English; or
- The candidate provides proof of an Intermediate Plus or higher result on the New Brunswick Language Proficiency Evaluation or equivalent

Faculty reserves the right to request that the applicant complete an approved Language Evaluation, at any time during the Selection Process.

This is to ensure the candidate possesses the necessary language abilities to be successful in the program. The cost of the language assessment remains the responsibility of the candidate. (Estimated Cost: \$60)

International Students

An international student is an individual who is a foreign-born person and who is not currently a citizen or permanent resident of Canada

International applicants will be enrolled into the same admissions pathways as Canadian applicants.

As such, international applicants must submit the same prerequisites as is required by Canadian applicants.

In addition, the international applicant must:


 Submit proof of permission to study in Canada

It remains the responsibility of the international applicant to provide all documentation to the Academy in **English.**

The Academy understands that this may mean some documentation submitted will be "unofficial." It is for that reason that the Academy requires both an official copy of a prerequisite, along with a copy that is translated in English.
